Jake is currently an Assistant coach with the **Belleville Bulls of the Ontario Hockey League** and has served as an assistant coach with Team Ontario the last two years.

The Under-17 Policy Committee is also pleased to announce that they have selected Troy Smith and Drake Berehowsky as Team Ontario assistant coaches for the next two years. Mr. Smith is an assistant coach with the Kitchener Rangers of the Ontario Hockey League while Mr. Berehowsky is an assistant coach with the Barrie Colts of the Ontario Hockey League.

The coaching staff together with Director of Operations Rob Kitamura will be attending the regional under-17 identification camps throughout the Province during the months of April and May 2009. The identification process will conclude with the under-17 Provincial camp that is being held at Ottawa University from June 25th to June 28th 2009 and hosted by the Ottawa District Hockey Association.

The Ontario Under -17 Program is a component of **Hockey Canada's Program of Excellence** and is co-ordinated through the **Hockey Development Centre for Ontario** on behalf of their **3 Ontario Branches.** The program receives financial support from the **Ministry of Health Promotion**. In total, more than 1,500 players will participate at regional under-17 identification camps throughout Ontario this spring.
