Funding Support:

The HDCO is the coordinating body for the HTCP program in Ontario. Each year, approximately 9,000 trainers are certified through the HTCP. Courses can be taken online or in a live classroom setting.

Penalty Free Sweepstakes:

The HDCO has been the coordinating and administrative centre for the highly successful Penalty Free Sweepstakes. The contest is held annually and is open to any amateur hockey team in Ontario who plays a penalty free hockey game during the contest period.

Resource Centre: The HDCO operates one of the most extensive Resource Centers in North America for technical hockey information. Hundreds of videos/DVDs, manuals, drill books and coaching aids are available. Products can be purchased at our office or online.

Other Safety Initiatives:

The HDCO Plays a vital role in safety and risk management issues that face amateur hockey. Providing a safe environment for all hockey participants to play is a cornerstone of the future of our game.



Protective Equipment Do's & Don'ts

rotective equipment plays a crucial role in the prevention of injuries and as a hockey Traine trainer, you and your coaches have a responsibility to advise parents and players regarding proper fit, protective quality and maintenance of equipment.

Three important factors should be stressed when evaluating hockey equipment: 1) that the equipment fits properly 2) that the equipment is in proper condition to provide effective protection and 3) that the equipment is properly maintained throughout its life span.

As a hockey trainer you should be aware of all official rules and policies pertaining to hockey equipment.

- ⇒ Do conduct regular equipment checks throughout the playing season to ensure that players are properly and safely equipped at all times.
- ⇒ Do discard and replace any piece of equipment with a

break or crack in its main structural surface (e.g. Helmet, shin pad)

- ⇒ Do ensure that all equipment including hockey bags are washed/cleaned on a regular basis
 - ⇒ Do practice good team hygiene by ensuring that all players and staff have their own water bottles.
- ⇒ Do be prepared by ensuring that you have extra supplies such as screws, fasteners, tape, laces and elastics and the presence of important tools like screw drivers, pliers, scissors, sharpening stones and a small hack saw.
- ⇒ Do not modify equipment in any way that reduces its protective quality.
- ⇒ Do not buy equipment to grow into because if it is too big it will slide away from the area that it is meant to protect.
